





On March 1st, we will change our charity to one of the GFWC affiliate organizations: March of Dimes. This charity was founded by Franklin D. Roosevelt on January 3, 1938, as a response to

the U.S. epidemic of polio, a condition that can leave people with permanent physical disabilities. The organization to combat polio was called the National Foundation for Infantile Paralusis. Over the years, their mission has changed. In the mid 1960's, the organization focused its efforts on prevention of birth defects and infant mortality. In 1976, the name changed to March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation and in 2005 their mission focused on reducing the toll of premature birth. Today, this organization fights for the health of all moms and babies. Their goals are to end the



preventable maternal health risks and deaths, end preventable preterm birth and infant death and close the health equity gap. Since our February Charity, the American Heart Association, reached close to 1,800 miles, our March challenge is to reach a total of 2,000 miles.





### GFWC Signature Program: Domestic & Sexual Violence Awareness & Prevention

A focus area of the GFWC Signature Program is to raise awareness of child abuse and neglect. The Children's Advocacy Center of Brevard is an organization serving abused and neglected children in Brevard County. They coordinate the investigation, treatment and prosecution of child abuse cases by using teams of professionals involved in child protective and victim advocacy services, law enforcement and prosecution, and physical and mental health.

GFWC is committed to supporting and educating future generations bu preserving women's history, promoting leadership opportunities, and engaging in advocacy efforts that empower Through programs, women. scholarships, and community initiatives, GFWC ensures that young women understand their history and have the tools to shape the future.

By learning about and sharing the stories of pioneering women, we keep their legacy alive and inspire future generations. Women's History Month is a reminder of how far we've come—and how much further we can go.
